What is the Hemophilia Assistance Program?



We are here to help adult Texans with hemophilia pay their medical bills.

Assistance is provided with blood factor replacement products or reimbursement for health insurance premium payments.

What is Hemophilia?

Hemophilia is a disorder in which your blood does not clot properly because of a lack of clotting factor proteins. This can lead to bleeding for no reason, and bleeding after injuries or surgery. Hemophilia is an inherited (genetic) disorder. It is found mostly in males, but females can be carriers, capable of passing the disorder on to their children. Hemophilia is most often treated with regular injections or infusions of the missing clotting factors.

How Can I Find Services?

You can receive assistance through HAP if you're a Texas resident, 18 or older and have a diagnosis of hemophilia from a licensed physician. For additional eligibility requirements and instructions on how to apply, visit hhs.texas.gov/services/health/hemophilia-assistance-program.
