



## Consent for a person sponsoring an immigrant

This person is applying for state benefits: \_\_\_\_\_ .

This person said that they are an immigrant and that you are their sponsor. Because they are applying for benefits, they must give us: (1) your name, (2) your Social Security number, (3) your address, (4) the amount of money you get each month, and (5) the value of things you pay for or own (for example: cash, money in the bank, insurance policies, stocks, homes and other property).

To make sure the facts we have about you are correct, we will use electronic databases from one or more of the following: (1) the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), (2) the Social Security Administration, (3) the Department of Homeland Security, and (4) a consumer reporting agency. If the facts we have about you don't match the databases, we might ask you to send us other items or forms.
