S.B. 809 and Rider 143 COVID-19 Funds Reporting

Background



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The 87th Texas Legislature directed the Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) to report federal COVID-19 funding from specific health care institutions, and certain costs those providers have spent related to COVID-19 public health emergency.

Background (cont.)



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- Senate Bill 809
- Rider 143
- Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §355.7201

Health Care Institutions Required to Report



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- Ambulatory Surgical Center
- Assisted Living Facility licensed under Chapter 247, Health and Safety Code
- Emergency Medical Services provider
- Health Services District created under Chapter 287, Health and Safety Code
- Home and Community Support Services Agency
- Hospice
- Hospital

Health Care Institutions Required to Report (cont.)



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- Hospital system
- Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with an Intellectual Disability or Related Conditions (ICF/IID)
- Community Living Assistance and Support Services (CLASS) Direct Service Agency (DSA) or Case Management Agency (CMA)
- Deaf-Blind with Multiple Disabilities (DBMD)
- Home and Community-Based Services/Texas Home Living (HCS/TxHmL)
- Nursing Facility
- End-Stage Renal Disease Facility licensed under Section 251.011, Health and Safety Code

Reporting



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- **Initial Report**

- January 2020 through August 2021
- Due October 1, 2021.

- **Ongoing Reporting**

- Monthly
- Due on the 15th day of the following month

Failure to Submit



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- Report sent to the Department of State Health Services or HHSC Regulatory Services.
- Potential adverse actions on your licensure and/or;
- HHSC may initiate payment holds for providers who fail to submit the required monthly reports.
