



Medicaid Provider Notification

The attached flyer was developed by the Health and Human Services Commission to be used as a training tool to help providers teach Medicaid members about small alternative devices (SAD). The flyer shows each vendor's SAD, comparing each to everyday objects. Provider agency staff should use this training flyer only if the Medicaid member does not have a home landline phone, or if the member refuses to allow provider agency staff to use his or her home phone. After the member has received education regarding EVV and signs the SAD agreement, the provider agency staff may use the attached material to teach the member about the SAD device that will be placed in their home. Only then should the flyer be given to the member. The provider-selected EVV vendor's SAD also should be identified to the member.

This flyer is an optional tool to be used at the provider's discretion.

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Size comparisons between three EVV devices and common household objects.




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Size comparison between an EVV device and common household object.



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
